Greencore joins initiative to support survivors of modern slavery

Greencore, a leading UK manufacturer of convenience foods, is pleased to be joining forces with Asda in an innovative project to help support survivors of modern slavery.

The project, *Ingredients 4 Life*, supports survivors of modern slavery through teaching them vital culinary skills to use in their homes. Originally designed and successfully piloted face-to-face in early 2019 by ASDA, a Greencore customer, and Sheffield-headquartered charity City Hearts, Greencore and The Snowdrop Project, a Sheffield based charity providing community support to survivors of modern slavery, have together adapted the model to a digital setting.

This summer, Greencore chefs will host a series of three online cookery lessons for clients of The Snowdrop Project. The hour-long interactive sessions will be filmed at Greencore's new product development theatre in Kiveton, South Yorkshire and broadcast via Zoom to the clients, who will take part in the lessons in the safety of their own residences. Prior to each lesson, the participants will receive a box of ingredients from Greencore direct to their door, with each session themed around healthy eating, sustainability, and eating on a budget.

Feedback from the original pilot scheme was overwhelmingly positive, with those attending the sessions reporting an improvement in motivation, self-confidence and trust; improved knowledge of what is needed for a healthy lifestyle; and an improved sense of independence. If the new, digital format of the scheme proves a success, there are plans to develop further partner collaborations and together reach greater numbers of modern slavery survivors all across the UK.

Commenting on this initiative, Phill Clayton of City Hearts and Anna Smith of Asda said: "We are excited about the adaptation of the Asda and City Hearts Ingredients 4 Life model into a digital setting by Snowdrop and Greencore. This is another example of the positive impact that can be brought about through survivor-focused business and charity collaboration."
